


Impulse Statement



Conclusions

- Current opportunities exist for supplementary livelihoods in coral restoration based on combination of grant funding and private sector driven sustainable financing mechanisms
- Adaptation funds should seek to encourage meaningful and long-term participation of private sector in funding coral restoration
- There is need to mainstream coral restoration as a new livelihood, like forestry, with recognized qualifications (e.g. NVQs) and emphasis on coastal communities and vulnerable socioeconomic groups
